



## **Common Misconception: Richer Than Countries?**

It's often misconstrued that because BlackRock and Vanguard manage trillions, they are "richer" than entire nations. For instance, their combined assets under management (~\$22 trillion) are sometimes compared to the GDPs of major countries. However, GDP measures a country's annual economic output, while AUM represents the total value of assets managed. Moreover, these assets belong to their clients, not to BlackRock or Vanguard themselves.





"BlackRock and Vanguard run the world because they own stakes in almost every major company." – You've probably heard this before. But is it really true?

They Manage, But Don't Own BlackRock and Vanguard collectively manage over \$22 trillion in assets:

• BlackRock: \$11.6 trillion AUM

• Vanguard: \$10.4 trillion AUM

They are significant shareholders in companies like **Apple, Microsoft, Google, Amazon, and Tesla**. However, they **don't own these companies**—they invest on behalf of **pension funds, institutions, and individual investors**.





## Do They Control These Companies? 🏦

Holding substantial shares grants them **voting rights** in corporate decisions, influencing policies on **CEO appointments, governance, and sustainability**. However, they **don't manage daily operations** or dictate business strategies.

A Simple Analogy Think of BlackRock and Vanguard as mutual fund managers. Imagine 100 people pool their money to buy shares in companies. The fund manager handles the investments but doesn't own the shares personally—the investors do. Similarly, BlackRock and Vanguard manage money on behalf of their clients, not for themselves.

The Influence They Wield Pheir power stems from the vast assets they manage, not from personal ownership. While they shape global markets and have a voice in major corporate decisions, they don't directly control these companies.





So, do they run the world? Not exactly. But by managing assets for a multitude of investors, they wield significant influence in the corporate sphere.
