



What Are Overheads?

Overheads are indirect costs that cannot be directly traced to a specific product or service but are essential for business operations.



Why It Matters?

- Helps in cost control
- Improves pricing decisions
- Increases profitability



Manufacturing Overheads

The costs related to production but not directly tied to a specific product.

Examples:

- Factory rent
- Machine maintenance
- Indirect labor (supervisors, security staff)
- Electricity & utilities for production



Administrative Overheads

The costs elated to the general management & administration of the business.



Examples:

- Office rent
- Salaries of managers & admin staff
- Legal & audit fees
- Office supplies & utilities



Selling & Distribution Overheads

The costs incurred in selling & delivering products/services.

Examples:

- Advertisement & marketing
- Sales commissions
- Delivery & logistics costs
- Customer service expenses
